The IARC Monographs identify environmental factors that are carcinogenic hazards to humans.These include chemicals, complex mixtures, occupational exposures, physical agents, biological agents, and lifestyle factors. National health agencies can use this information as scientific support for their actions to prevent exposure to potential carcinogens.

The IARC Working Group concluded that there was limited evidence in humans that night shift work causes breast, prostate, and colorectal cancer in this latest evaluation. 1 It is intriguing that the progression of breast, prostate, and colorectal cancer are each influenced by sex hormones. 2

In addition, IARC analyzed another 81 assays exploring other possible genotoxic mechanisms (mostly related to sex hormones and oxidative stress), of which 62 (77%) reported positive results. IARC placed considerable weight on three positive GBH studies in exposed human populations, whereas EPA placed little or no weight on them.

Fifteen monographs in this volume are devoted to individual naturally occurring and synthetic oestrogens and progestins. Since the evaluation of the carcinogenic risk of sex hormones is both urgent and complex, a special chapter, 'Oestrogens and Progestins in Relation to Human Cancer', is devoted to epidemiological studies carried out on people receiving a mixture of hormones.

According to IARC's press release, epidemiological studies found positive associations between exposure to DDT and non-Hodgkin lymphoma, testicular cancer, and liver cancer, and "strong experimental evidence" shows that DDT can suppress the immune system and disrupt sex hormones. IARC classified the herbicide 2,4-D as possibly carcinogenic to humans based on "inadequate evidence" of its carcinogenicity in humans and "limited evidence" in experimental animals.
