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### Stonewall Attack

The Stonewall Attack is a chess opening characterized by White (generally) playing their pawns to d4 and e3, playing Bd3, Nd2, and then playing pawns to c3 and then f4; although the moves are not always played in that order (see transposition ).

### Chess Opening: The Stonewall Attack (Example Game)

The stonewall attack is a powerful and solid opening that prevents black from controlling the center. Some key points are: White will have control of the dark squares (d4, e3, and f4), so it is important to take control of the light squares with his pieces (Bd3, Nd2, Nf3, etc) He must also prevent black from playing...e5 with a move like f4.

### What are the advantages of the Stonewall attack?

There has been almost no serious interest in the Stonewall since the turn of the last century, when it was adopted occasionally by the likes of Pillsbury (before he discovered his Pillsbury Attack in the Queen's Gambit).
